Rehabilitation of this bridge, a historic landmark as well as a component of the transportation routes that move people in and out of downtown Bastrop, is necessary to ensure safety, connectivity, and mobility so the RAISE grant application process is timely.

The Old Iron Bridge is an important multi-modal connection across the Colorado River, linking two sides of the City and providing a gateway to the Historic Commercial District.
