UPDATES:

The Design Committee is continuing the work to enhance Bastrop's investments for Downtown Main Street.

Submitted new designs for the Old Iron Bridge flags (9), to be reprinted in a larger format with ventilation pockets.

Rebranding City Parking lots with new identities and signage to call out Bastrop's certified Bird City designation. Looking at renaming the lots:

- RED - Cardinal or Woodpecker
- BLUE - Blue Heron or King Fisher
- GRAY BLACK - Wild Turkey or Blue Heron (which is more gray than blue)
- ORANGE - Barred Owl
- GREEN - Pine Warbler

Our new Community Impact Manager is working on sharable tri-fold parking map.

Overlaying street map with new trash can placement, bike racks (2 sizes) and temporary art installations from The Foundry.
