Backyard Birds

The Bastrop Cultural Arts Commission works to expand the opportunities for public Bastrop. One recent project, the Bastrop Bird Junction, art helping enhance the creative and artistic landscape in the community, and arts destination. The Commission establishes Bastrop cultural as а seeking proposals for sculpture from independent artists, related to Bastrop's recent designation as a Bird City.

In 2020 Texas Parks and Wildlife declared Bastrop a "Bird City Texas Certified Community", providing habitat and protection for native and migratory birds.

This iconic art project series, *Birds of Bastrop*, needs to reflect and celebrate our new identity as a Bird City. Depictions, whether realistic, expressionistic, symbolic or abstract, are required to include native bird species, or those species that migrate through the Bastrop area. (The project must be attached to a hand railing on a pedestrian bridge. Please see details and photos below.)

Please read the following information and criteria carefully. Applications must be complete and projects must follow all guidelines for acceptance and consideration.

2025 Call for Entries

You are invited to submit your proposal to be displayed in a public space. The following criteria are required:

- 1. The iconic art project must depict the **various Backyard Birds**, that are native or migratory in the Bastrop area, as requested by the donor funding the project. The birds will be attached to an existing handrail of a pedestrian bridge. The measurements are: Height- 5 foot tall- Maximum 30 foot width. Handrail width- 4 inches. **Project may not block pathway of walking bridge- so maximum width of project should be close to 4 inches**. (See images). The project can be a series of separate attached pieces on the handrail. The birds may be attached to fabricated poles atop the handrail. **Please specify how pieces are attached**.
- 3. This project can be in any medium including, but not limited to: ceramics, stone, metal, glass, etc. *Preference is given to brighter, more colorful concepts*. No reproductions of original art will be accepted. No copywritten logos or advertisements may be included.
- 4. The call is open to all artists without geographic distinctions or restrictions.
- 5. Each artist may submit **up to 3 images** of the proposed original art for consideration. A high-resolution digital or hand-drawn image of at least 300 dpi and 5x7 size is required to be juried. **You do not need to produce a detailed, polished representation of the project. We simply require an image that will convey the project and style.

Please note that the quality of the image can influence the jury process. Artists must also submit prior work examples and attach references such as websites or social media account. No substitutions will be allowed after the juried process has been completed. Send all images, including an artist's photo by email listed below.

- 6. Upon artist selection and design approval, the project will begin production. Selection will be done by jurying process by members of the Iconic Art Subcommittee of the Cultural Arts Commission for final decision. Compensation will include a budget of \$25,000* which includes design, supplies and labor for the project. The selected artist will also be recognized at an appreciation event, the date of which is to be determined.
- 7. The artist selected to exhibit will be required to sign an Artist's Agreement with the City of Bastrop that will detail the rights and responsibilities of all parties related to staging, installation, security, materials, liability and removal, etc.

Design Limitations

All project submissions must be "family appropriate" and pose no risk to public safety; nothing of sexual, violent, or political nature shall be accepted. No advertisements or copywritten material is allowed, however, the Artist may incorporate his/her signature into the design. Project supplies and submissions must be compatible with outdoor elements by using materials impervious to UV and weather deterioration.

Upon acceptance, a representative from the Iconic Art Committee will communicate sizing limitations, once a site is approved by Bastrop City Council.
